
The number of African think tanks increased by 24% in the last 5 years

Eastern Africa	223	266	19%
Western Africa	181	222	23%
Central Africa	42	53	26%
Northern Africa	81	120	48%
Total	649	803	24%


African think tanks face many challenges

Think tanks have a key role in knowledge creation and dissemination

Global research and knowledge production

- Peer-reviewed publications and citations
- Exchanges between scholars

Knowledge systems

- Knowledge system solves local problems and supports sustainable capacity for research
- Diversity of research

Evidence informed policy-making (EIP) and capacity for EIP

- Policy engagement metrics (presence in policy discussions and media)
- Expanded networks
- Uptake in policy or practice
- Organizational development and sustainability

Research

- Increase opportunities & collaborations for independent researchers and scholars
- Stay away from entitlement agendas and benefits to narrow interest groups



Knowledge Management

- Greater involvement of public in knowledge dissemination
- Create knowledge products that governments can consume to improve policy making



Funding

- Diversify funding sources to pursue local & regional paradigms and agendas
- Convince "enlightened individuals" to become funders
- Create programs with accessible funding amounts that offer greater equality for applicants and partnership opportunities
